"All My Rowdy Friends" was the 49th single released during Hank Jr.'s relationship with Mike Curb; the first numberone single - which Curb co-wrote - came in 1970 when Mike was president of MGM. Singles followed on Warner/Curb and Elektra/Curb.

"If ever there was a country record that was really a rock n' roll record, it was this one," said Curb. "It was also the first video of ours to win the CMA Video Award."

That video included a number of country stars, from Waylon Jennings to Kris Kristofferson. "All My Rowdy Friends" went on to become the Monday Night

Football theme song.

"There are records that cross genres without ever crossing charts," Curb said. "This never crossed on to any rock or pop chart, but it crossed into the rock audience. Not all country people are rock fans, but they all love Hank."

This record reached number 10 on the Country, number eight on the Country Sales, and number 14 on the Country Airplay charts. Hank Williams Jr. has had 46 chart albums and 86 chart singles with Curb; 38 of those have been Top Ten, and 10 of those have been number one.

The duet recording of "Two Old Cats Like Us" is a very clear example of the legendary R&B artist Ray Charles' interpretation of country music in a manner that no other R&B artist has ever been able to achieve.

Likewise, Hank Williams Jr., as a country artist, has successfully merged rock n' roll and R&B throughout his legendary career. It was a natural thing for the two of


them to record together, and a great moment in the history of the record business.

The Little River Band was formed in 1979 in Melbourne, Australia, an outgrowth of the group Mississippi that featured Beeb Birtles, Graham Goble and Derek Pellicci as members. Those three – along with Glenn Shorrock, Roger McLachlan and Rick Formosa formed the country/pop vocal harmony group.

There were a number of personnel changes through the years, including the addition of John Farnham as vocalist before he left for a solo career. Over the period of a dozen years, The Little River Band had 16 chart singles on the Hot 100.



"Tiny Little Heart Attack" comes from the action/comedy film Career Opportunities. The movie involves a jail break, stolen diamonds, and a newsman who has been fired from his job but has a chance to get it back because he's a part of this big story. In the end, all's

well that ends well, and this story ends with recovered diamonds and a romantic wedding.

The recording group, Money Talks, was brought to Curb by their managers and producers, Paul Palmer and Jeffrey Shucraft.

"Funny How Time Slips Away" by Al Green and Lyle Lovett won a Grammy by bringing together two of the most uniquely gifted artists in the music business. The song – originally recorded by Willie Nelson – was perfect (1964), Dorothy Moore (1976) and The Spinners (1983). because of its history as both a country and an R&B song.

In country, it has been a chart record for Billy Walker (1961), Narvel Felts (1975) and Danny Davis & Willie Nelson (1980); in R&B, it made the charts for Joe Hinton




Hank Thompson's first hit came in 1948; "Six Pack To Go" was Hank's 41st chart record and 25th Top Ten. Released in 1960, the record also reached the Pop chart.

Thompson served in the Navy during World War II, where he began his career as a performer. In 1997, Curb Records released Hank Thompson And Friends, which

featured the Country Music Hall of Famer in duets with Lyle Lovett, George Jones, Kitty Wells, and - on "Six Pack to Go" - with Vince Gill, who is now himself a member of the Country Music Hall of Fame.

Hank Thompson has released five albums for Curb including all of his hits.


Moe Bandy had more than a decade's worth of hits, beginning with his "I Just Started Hatin' Cheatin' Songs Today." He joined Curb Records in 1986 when his manager, Woody Bowles, brought the singer to the label. His second release was "Till I'm Too Old To Die

Young," which went to number six on the Country chart in Billboard.

Jerry Kennedy produced this record for Bandy, as well as "Americana," which reached number eight on the Country charts in 1988.

hit with "It's Only Make Believe" on MGM in 1958; in 1966, he moved over to country music and had a string of hits, but "It's Only Make Believe" was always a standard part of his show.

Ronnie McDowell's first hit was "The King Is Gone," a tribute to Elvis Presley released shortly after Elvis died in 1977. He got his start as a recording artist because his voice sounded so much like Elvis's, but McDowell carved out his own career on Epic and Curb Records.

McDowell joined Curb Records in 1986, and in 1988, his recording of "It's

Conway Twitty had a number-one rock Only Make Believe" reached number eight on the Country chart.

> "Buddy Killen introduced me to Ronnie McDowell," said Curb. "It was a special event when he recorded an up tempo version of 'It's Only Make Believe' with Conway Twitty. These are the records that really mean a lot to me, because they connect us to our past. Curb Records is 50 years of rock n' roll, and this song takes us back to our roots. To have Conway Twitty sing on someone else's version of his big rock hit - well, it had to be darn good. This is a very special record."


Jerry Dunphy was the leading television news anchor in Southern California for more than 30 years. He was also Mike Curb's father-in-law.

Dunphy and Curb wrote "She's My Saturday Night Special" as a duet for Curb's long time friends Wayne Newton and Ronnie McDowell.

"While The Feeling's Good" was

recorded as a duet with Newton and Tammy Wynette and became a Billboard chart single, and "The Letter" by Wayne Newton reached the number-one position on the Cashbox chart.

Curb says that "Wayne Newton has so much talent that he can sing and perform virtually every form of music known to man."

Merry Clayton was born on Christmas Day in New Orleans. She was a member of The Raeletts – the backing group for Ray Charles – and was in the movie *Maid To Order* (1987).

Clayton released "Yes" in 1988, the third single from the soundtrack of *Dirty Dancing* that followed two hits in "The Time Of My Life" by Bill Medley and

Jennifer Warnes and "She's Like The Wind" by Patrick Swayze.

On the flip side of "Yes," which was released on RCA, was "In The Still Of The Night," the classic song recorded originally by The Five Satins. The record was produced by Michael Lloyd for Curb Productions.



The producer of the motion picture *Dirty Dancing* was looking for a ballad and Michael Lloyd thought a song Patrick Swayze had written sounded like a good fit.

Swayze's recording of "She's Like The Wind" became a major hit, reaching number three on the *Billboard* Hot 100 and number one on the *Billboard* Adult Contemporary chart.

Johnny Cash and Hank Williams Jr. were long-time friends. Merle Kilgore, who wrote "Ring Of Fire" and was Cash's best man at his wedding to June Carter, was Hank's manager and best friend.

Hank and Johnny joined forces to record a duet on "That Old Wheel" for Curb's album. Curb combined the song with Johnny's greatest records from three different companies. This resulted in a gold album for Curb Records.

Johnny Cash had 138 songs on the *Billboard* Country Singles chart; Hank Williams Jr. had 106; the two account for 244 singles on the country charts – and still counting!

The Mike Curb Foundation has purchased the artifacts from the Johnny Cash Museum and brought the museum to Nashville's Music Row.

The Judds first single was the Top 20 record "Had A Dream," and their second was "Mama He's Crazy," which went all the way to number one - the first of eight straight number-ones for the hottest duo in country music during the 1980s.

"Grandpa (Tell Me 'Bout The Good Old Days," written by Jamie O'Hara, was their seventh single release and sixth consecutive number one. The song holds special meaning for the Mike Curb family because his daughters entered the funeral of their grandfather - Mike's father while this song played.

"Rockin' With The Rhythm Of The Rain" followed "Grandpa" and "Love Can Build A Bridge" as their twenty-first

single. It won Grammys for Song of the Year and Vocal Duo of the Year in the country field.

Mike Curb was privileged to witness Carl Perkins playing guitar on "Let Me Tell You About Love," a song Perkins wrote and recorded with The Judds. One of the pioneers of rockabilly, Carl Perkins was an early witness to the birth of rock n' roll at Sam Phillips' Sun Studios in Memphis.

This release reached the number one spot on the Country chart in 1989 - the 14th number one for The Judds, out of 17 chart singles. The Judds had 25 chart singles by 2000, with an amazing 20 of them being in the Top 10 of the Country charts.



Rad is a film about the BMX craze of the 1980s, and it features some extreme stunts on bicycles. Directed by Hal Needham and starring Bill Allen, Lori Loughlin, Talia Shire, Ray Walston and Jack Weston, this was a

movie that young guys loved.

"Break The Ice" by John Farnham was recorded for the movie. A major rock star in Australia, Farnham was also one of the lead singers for The Little River Band.

The band Sparks was formed in 1971 in Los Angeles, comprised of Ron Mael, Russell Mael, Earle Mankey, Jim Mankey and Harley Feinstein. The Mael brothers were the creative center for the group, who had been signed to Bearsville in the early '70s under the name Halfnelson.

After their debut album missed, they changed their name to Sparks. The Maels moved to England and were produced by Muff Winwood, brother of Steve. They returned to the United States in 1976.

Sparks is a dance act, a genre that has always been successful for Curb Records. "Music That You Can Dance To" was released in the summer of 1986, and it reached number six on the Club chart and number 11 on the Dance Sales chart in Billboard.

The Beat Farmers were a good-time, beer-drinking, club-playing band formed in the San Diego area in 1983. Led by party animal Dan McLain – who went by the name Country Dick Montana - the group released their first album in 1985 before signing with Curb.

They played Europe several times, performing with a rebellious, devil-may-care attitude and an off-center sense

of humor. The band ended on November 8, 1995, when drummer Country Dick, who battled throat cancer, had a heart attack during a club performance and died.

"Dark Light" came from their The Pursuit Of Happiness album, and the song reached the Top 30 on Billboard's Main Rock chart.



There is nothing more painful in the music industry than for an artist to lose his life. In this case Rick Nelson was recording what would be his come back album for Curb Records in 1985 when he lost his life on New Year's Eve of that year. Rick had an amazing career in the music industry that started when he was a young boy on the Ozzie and Harriet television show, starring with his parents and his older brother David. Rick started out singing on the family television show and he was ultimately signed by Imperial Records, which was the label owned by Lou Chudd and operated by Mike Curb's mentor, Eddie Ray. Rick recorded for four different labels, including Verve, Decca, Imperial and Curb. In addition to having the first number one record with "Poor Little Fool" on the Billboard Hot 100 chart when it started in 1958, Rick had 20 top ten records on the Billboard chart and was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

Like so many teen artists, as time passed by, Rick wanted to do more of his own new music and formed his own band The Stone Canyon Band, but wherever he performed, his audiences wanted to hear his hits. This resulted in a performance at Madison Square Garden where he was booed by the audience for not singing his hits, but it also spawned the recording of "Garden Party" that played a major part in re-launching his career. Because of the fact that his hits were on various labels and because of the fact that "Garden Party" featured his lower, more mature voice, Rick was willing to compromise with his fans and re-record his hits as close to the original versions as possible, but featuring the vocal sound that he had on "Garden Party". This resulted in the album Best Of Ricky Nelson which Curb Records released shortly after his death and which has been certified as a Gold record by the Recording Industry Association of America.

"Wild Thing," written by Chip Taylor - brother of actor Ion Voight – was a number-one hit by The Troggs in 1966. Curb compiled the soundtrack for the baseball comedy film Major League, released in 1989 and starring Tom Berenger, Charlie Sheen, Corbin Bernsen, Margaret Whitton, Wesley Snipes and Bob Uecker.

Because the original version of "Wild Thing" was unavailable, the version by the group "X" became the theme for the movie, and subsequently became a baseball anthem for the soundtrack on Curb Records.



Stryper stands for "Salvation Through Redemption Yielding Peace, Encouragement and Righteousness." The name was inspired by the biblical verse in Isaiah that states "With His stripes we are healed." Formed in 1983 by brothers Michael and Robert Sweet with guitarist Oz Fox in Orange County, California, they released "Always There For You" in 1988. The song rose to number 71 on

Billboard's Hot 100 chart.

Stryper was on Enigma Records – an independent label distributed by Capitol - and Michael Lloyd produced them for Mike Curb Productions. Although they were a controversial act in Christian music, they had a large, loyal following in both the Christian and rock fields.

Jerry Lee Lewis came from rock n' roll's stamp on the second verse. Lewis has womb - the Sun Records Studio in Memphis, owned and operated by Sam Phillips where Jerry Lee recorded "Whole Lot Of Shakin' Going On" and "Great Balls Of Fire," both in 1957.

Lewis, born in 1935, has never lost his rock n' roll soul, and on this duet with Ronnie McDowell he plays his driving, pumping piano and puts his personal

Big Bill Lister recorded the Hank Williams song "There's A Tear In My Beer," which he released in 1952; years later, he found the original acetate of the demo by Hank and gave it to Hank Jr.

Through the magic of technology, Hank Williams Jr. was able to record a duet with his father. A clip of Hank Williams Sr. from The Kate Smith Show was used to

compile the music video for this song, which won the Country Music Association's Video of the Year honors in 1989. That year, the song reached number seven on the Country chart.

"This recording would not have been possible without Jim Ed Norman, who contributed his talents to many records of ours," said Mike Curb.



Real Life is an Australian group that was formed in Melbourne in the early 1980s by David Sterry and George Pappas. They released "Send Me An Angel" from their debut album *Heartland*. It was an international hit; in the United States it was Top 20 on the Main Rock, Top 30 on the Hot 100 and on the Club charts in *Billboard* in 1984.

In 1989, the single became a multigenre crossover hit again, reaching number three on the Dance Sales and number five on the Club, and Top 30 on the Hot Airplay, Hot 100 and Hot Sales charts. The record was featured in Jason Bateman's movie *Teen Wolf Too* on the Curb Records soundtrack.





At the time that the movie *Ghost* was being completed, Mike Curb needed a recording of "Unchained Melody" by The Righteous Brothers – it was originally a Top Five hit by the group in 1965. He called Bill Medley, who promised that he and Bobby Hatfield - the other Righteous Brother – would produce the session.

Things did not go well at first, so Curb contacted Buddy Killen, who had produced the song with Ronnie McDowell. But Medley told Mike that The Righteous Brothers had finally "hooked" the new recording, and the single went

Platinum when it was released in 1990. Curb also issued a dance version of the song, and then had The Righteous Brothers re-record their old hits, which resulted in a multi-platinum album.



The Bar-Kays, formed in Memphis in the mid-'60s, became known as one of the top back-up groups. They suffered a tragedy in 1967 when their plane crashed, killing Otis Redding and four members of the group. Ben Cauley was the only survivor; James Alexander was spared when he missed the flight.

In late 1968, Cauley and Alexander re-formed the

Bar-Kays, but Cauley soon left. Alexander remained the core member of the group, who has backed the Staple Singers, Albert King, Carla Thomas, Johnnie Taylor and Isaac Hayes; the group backed Hayes on his 1971 album Shaft. In 1995, they had an R&B chart record with their instrumental "The Slide" on Basix/Curb Records.


Hal Ketchum was born in Greenwich, New York, grew up near Vermont, and moved to Florida when he was 17. He then went to Texas, where he worked as a RER. This was followed by "I Know carpenter before moving to Nashville in 1986 to concentrate on his songwriting.

After a stint on a small indie label, Ketchum signed with Curb Records,

where his first song, "Small Town Saturday Night," in 1991 became the number-one record for the entire year in Where Love Lives" (Top 15), then "Past The Point Of Rescue" in 1992 (number two). Hal's song "She Is" was featured in the motion picture *Zoe*.

Delbert McClinton and his band backed up Lightnin' Hopkins, Howlin' Wolf and Big Joe Turner during his stint in Fort Worth; later, he played harmonica on "Hey! Baby" by Bruce Channel.

On "Every Time I Roll The Dice," McClinton does a song by veteran songwriters Max D. Barnes and Troy Seals

under the production of Don Was. McClinton always preferred performing before a live audience rather than working in the studio. In this case, he worked on a record that reached the Top 15 on Billboard's Main Rock chart. This led to Delbert's biggest album, which included his Grammy-winning duet with Bonnie Raitt.




"ALL-TIME GREATEST HITS" ARTIST: DEAN MARTIN

We were fortunate to be able to release Dean Martin's greatest recordings featuring "You're Nobody Till Somebody Loves You". Shortly after the album was released, "That's Amore" became the theme song for the motion picture

Moonstruck which won the Academy Award with Olympia Dukakis. The album also featured many of the other great songs of Dean Martin. The album sold over one million copies.

The Curb Foundation is fortunate to own and to restore the classic Ouonset Hut recording studio which was the first studio on Music Row. Conway Twitty's classic recording of "It's Only Make Believe" was recorded at the Quonset Hut and our Greatest Hits album includes many of the songs that were originally rock and roll hits before Conway turned to country music. His rock and roll hits also included "I'll Try", "Danny Boy" and "Lonely Blue Boy". We later re-released "What Am I Living For" and had success at country radio and we released worldwide the recording of the Osmonds singing with Conway on "Heartache Tonight". Thanks to Buddy Killen and Jack Jackson we were able to release the final recordings of his greatest hits that Conway recorded shortly before his death.
