LEADERSHIP IN PUBLIC SERVICE

A chance opportunity to introduce Ronald Reagan ignited an old interest in politics that led Curb to the Governor's office and beyond.

Mike Curb's interest in politics started when he was a young boy in 1952, living in Compton, California. His grandmother encouraged him to watch the presidential nominating conventions on television. During the Republican convention, everyone thought that Senator Robert Taft was going to be the nominee, but General Dwight Eisenhower was nominated and eventually was elected president. His opponent was Senator Adlai Stevenson, who had been nominated by the Democratic convention.

Mike never was a part of any Republican club or group in high school or college. His grandmother was a Democrat and his mother was a Republican. As an FBI agent, his father was not allowed to show his support for either political party.

"My maternal grandmother never

liked Republicans, but she loved Ronald Reagan," Mike remembers. "My mother, a Republican, also loved Reagan, which made things interesting because they generally never agreed on anything politically."

Curb's grandmother was a Mexican-American from Texas, and his mother's father was a soldier and later a YMCA director

from Kentucky and Pennsylvania – a very staunch Republican. They canceled each other out when they voted. Mike's mother agreed with her father politically, but Mike's Democratic grandmother was the driving force in teaching him about Big Tent politics, the Reagan philosophy of including as many people from all walks of life as possible.

Mike Curb was one of the few people who had the opportunity to be involved in a significant way in all

three of Ronald Reagan's presidential campaigns. During the 1976 campaign, Mike was the California campaign co-chairman and was then elected to the Republican National Committee. In 1980, Curb and Jack Kemp were the national co-chairmen of Reagan's successful campaign for president. In 1982, after Mike completed his term as lieutenant governor and acting governor, Reagan called Mike and thanked him for helping to unite the party before asking him to work in his administration.

Mike agreed, provided it was a position where he was allowed to keep his private business; he did not want to take a government job that restricted his activities as a businessman or forced him to sell his businesses. Curb accepted the position of chairman of the Republican National Finance Committee, charged with raising \$100 million – the largest amount ever raised for a re-election campaign at the time.

Curb was just as much a neophyte when he entered government service as he was when he started in the music business, and Ronald Reagan became an important mentor. He took a liking to Mike when the two first met under very unusual circumstances. It was 1974, at an event for Junior Achievement in Los Angeles, as Reagan's term as governor of

California was coming to an end.

"I attended the Junior Achievement event because my father had suggested that I should go into public service," Mike says. "MGM Records had been sold and in order to receive my share of the payment as a co-owner of the company, I had agreed not to be active in the record business for a period of time.

"I was very close to my father, so when he suggested that I should go into public service, I asked him what he meant by that," Mike says. "He told me that a lot of young people might be interested in hearing the story of how I started a small, independent label that managed to get distribution from Capitol, a major label. I had started as an artist on Mercury and Warner-Reprise and then became the president of MGM and Verve, all in a period of approximately 10 years. He asked, 'Why not talk about that and encourage those young people to go to college, or junior college, or a trade school, or go out on their own and become an entrepreneur?' I took my father's advice, and I was invited by Junior Achievement to speak at this event. At that time, I had never given any sort of public speech or taken a public speaking course."

Ronald Reagan was the featured speaker at the event. Mike

had always admired and respected him because he was from the entertainment industry and yet had the ability to lead the state of California as governor. He looked up to Ronald Reagan in the same way that he looked up to his father.

At the Junior Achievement luncheon, Mike gave his first speech and, as he spoke, someone handed him a note saying that the person scheduled to introduce Ronald Reagan was stuck in traffic and asked if he would introduce him.

"I did not have a prepared introduction, but I knew about his career as an actor and that he had been a General Electric spokesperson and I heard him give speeches for the 1964 election between President Lyndon Johnson and Barry Goldwater," Mike says. "Everyone was searching for what America would become and, although I was just a teenager at the time, I remember that I had been inspired and motivated by his speech."

After Reagan's remarks, Mike had the opportunity to sit with him at lunch, where Reagan mentioned that he had seen the "Candy Man" event with Sammy Davis Jr. and Richard Nixon that Curb had arranged at the 1972 Republican convention. He told Mike that he would love to have some entertainers involved in his 1976 campaign for president.

To be in charge of entertainment in a political campaign is quite a job; not all entertainers support Republicans and it seemed that for every 10 entertainers Mike contacted there were nine who were Democrats. However, there was just something about Reagan that Mike really liked and admired.

"Reagan talked to me almost like a son at that time," he says. "He knew that I was a political neophyte, so he suggested a number of things that I should read and put me on a mailing list so I received copies of all of the speeches that he made."

Although Mike was only 29 years old, Ronald Reagan thought Curb had potential in government service. Mike's

grandmother was Mexican-American. She put herself through college and studied and loved American history and believed that everyone who benefitted from being an American citizen should serve the country in some way. She believed that service in the military, the Peace Corps or some other form of public service was important. Mike was able to tell her that he had accepted the position with Ronald Reagan's campaign for president shortly before she died.

Reagan had found himself going from a leading candidate – virtually unopposed for the Republican nomination – to running against Gerald Ford, the sitting president. Most Republicans gave their support to President Ford, including the person who was supposed to be his state chairman in California. Instead, Curb was named the state chairman.

Campaign manager Lyn Nofziger stated in his memoirs, "I don't know to this day if Ronald Reagan realizes what he owes Joe Rodgers, Jimmy Lyon and Mike Curb. Without those three, his 1976 campaign would have collapsed. He never would have had the opportunity to capture the hearts and souls of the rank-and-file of the Republican party during the 1976 National Convention. And without their support, there is little chance that he would have run for president in 1980."

The 1976 Republican National Convention was in Kansas City, and the Republicans had two great candidates, Gerald Ford and Ronald Reagan, from which to choose. Gerald Ford had enough delegates to win the nomination, but many believed that Ronald

Reagan had the hearts of the delegates. He could have most certainly been the nominee for vice president, but he did not want that.

Mike had the opportunity to spend quality time with Ronald Reagan and seemed to communicate well with him during his first presidential campaign. While he did not win the Republican nomination in 1976, he carried California and, since Curb was his state chairman, he was the leader of the California delegation to the national convention and was elected to be the Republican national

committeeman.

After the convention, Curb became co-chairman of the Ford Presidential campaign in California – at Reagan’s request – because it was important that California showed unity for the Republican nominee. Mike was only 31 years old at the time.

During the campaign, Curb’s friend Senator Bill Brock was elected national chairman of the Republican Party. In 1977, Brock named Mike to the Executive Committee of the Republican National Committee, a smaller group which oversees the national party. At that time, he was the youngest person to ever serve in that position.

During the Democratic primaries in 1976, California Governor Jerry Brown – who had been elected in 1974 – also ran for the nomination but lost to Carter. It seemed obvious to everyone that Brown would try to capture the Democratic nomination for president again in 1980, because he was traveling all over California as well as outside the state opposing Ronald Reagan’s record as governor. Reagan had defeated Brown’s father, Pat Brown, in the 1966 California gubernatorial election.

Ronald Reagan invited Curb to a courtesy lunch to let him know his plans for the future. He told Mike, “I wish someone like you were running for office, because the only way to beat Jerry Brown is to get someone younger than him to run against him.” Mike replied that he did not believe he was prepared at that time to run for governor, and that other Republicans had expressed interest.

At the end of that lunch, Reagan and Mike discussed the possibility of Curb running for lieutenant governor of California

because when the governor is out of the state, the lieutenant governor becomes acting governor. Reagan said a Republican as lieutenant governor would be a good incentive for Jerry Brown to stay in California, instead of traveling around the country criticizing Reagan's record as governor. "When he said this to me he was smiling," Mike says. "So I didn't really know if he was serious or not."

About a month later, Ken Rietz called and invited Mike to dinner and told him he had spoken with some people connected with Reagan – Lyn Nofziger, Mike Deaver and a few others – who thought Mike should run for lieutenant governor. He offered to introduce Mike to the top fundraisers aligned with Reagan and brief him on the top issues of the state.

Rietz came back with a list of people who would be willing to help if he ran for lieutenant governor, and it was virtually all of the people on Reagan's list of supporters – people like John Wayne and Jimmy Stewart, actors who were close with Ronald Reagan. In addition, Mike had developed a relationship with Holmes and Bob Tuttle, General William Lyon and Willa Dean Lyon, David Murdock, Burt and Jane Boeckman, Margaret Brock, Jolly and Patty Gissell and Ted Cummings, who were the top fundraisers in the entire state of California.

Mike had another meeting with Ronald Reagan, who told

him, "You should do this. If you are smart enough to start and run a successful business, then you are smart enough to learn these issues." Curb said "Reagan's staff arranged for me to be briefed by great members of the Reagan administration, including Ed Meece, William French Smith, Vern Orr, Bill Clark and Lyn Nofziger."

In 1978, Curb won the Republican nomination and later was elected lieutenant governor by defeating Jerry Brown's incumbent lieutenant governor. Brown was re-elected governor, which

Sinatra contributes to Curb

SACRAMENTO (AP) — Businesses, entertainers like Frank Sinatra, and key backers of President Reagan are among the contributors of \$1.09 million to support Lt. Gov. Mike Curb for governor.

The campaign financing reports of some prospective candidates were on file Wednesday in the secretary of state's office. Curb is far in front of his two

major rivals for the Republican nomination in 1982, Attorney General George Deukmejian and San Diego Mayor Pete Wilson. None has officially declared his candidacy.

About half of the money in Curb's report was in 48 contributions of \$10,000 or more. The largest was a \$50,000 donation from the William Lyon Co., a Newport Beach developer.

meant that — for the first time in modern history — a Democrat was governor while a Republican was lieutenant governor.

"I cannot tell you definitively how or why I won that election, but I can tell you that without the support of Ronald Reagan, who did television commercials for me or those involved in his campaign who encouraged and helped me, I would not have been elected lieutenant governor," Curb says. "Nor would I have ever had the opportunity to serve as acting governor of the largest state in the Union."

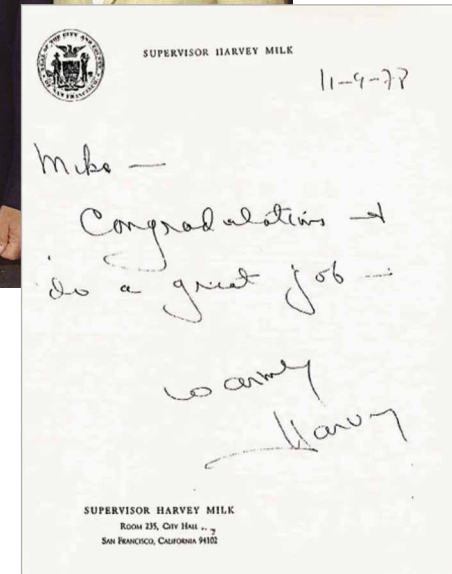
Curb stated, "As I reflect back about my election over 30 years ago, I realize that I was the last elected Republican lieutenant governor in the State of California. In addition to Ronald Reagan's support, I also was able to build a broad coalition of people from all walks of life that reflected the beautiful diversity of California. My sister, Carole, made television commercials, speaking in Spanish that she had learned from our grandmother. My mentor, Eddie Ray, helped organize African American supporters. Other mentors and friends of mine in the entertainment community, such as Robert and Loretta Lifton, Jerry Weintraub, Mo'Nique, Joe Smith, David Geffen and California attorney Bruce Ramer helped me build support in the entertainment

community and in the prominent Jewish community. Ramer arranged for Clint Eastwood to co-host a fundraising event for me. I

was able to receive support from former San Francisco Supervisor Harvey Milk because of the fact that I was working with him on an important civil rights ballot initiative that was being voted on at the same time I was running for office. I didn't realize how historic that was until the recent Academy Award-winning movie about Milk's life, where Sean Penn won the Academy Award and actual footage of me was included near the end of the movie. It's important today that elected officials recognize that once they are elected they need to represent all the people, whether they voted for

Court Affirms Curb's Power as Acting Governor

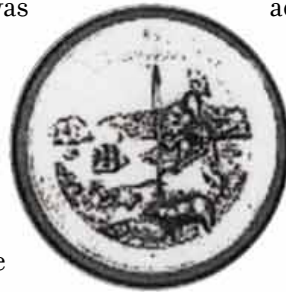
In a decision with major implications for Governor Brown's presidential bid and his tempestuous relationship with Lieutenant Governor Mike Curb, the California Supreme Court ruled yesterday that when the governor is out of state, the lieutenant governor is free to exercise all powers of the chief executive.

A significant victory

(Governor Jerry Brown) was out of state extensively and the Supreme Court of California ruled that Curb had the responsibility of Acting Governor while the Governor was out of state. While Curb was Acting Governor, he appointed the agriculture commissioner, economic development commission members, judges and others that were important. Curb also signed important bills, including the Rob A Home, Go To Jail Bill.

Because California is prone to natural disasters like forest fires, earthquakes, and mudslides, Curb was constantly dealing with emergencies. During that time, there were also threatened prison guard and rapid-transit district strikes, which Curb helped resolve.

The Brown administration did not like the fact that Curb was filling that role and filed litigation to bar him from being acting governor as provided in California's constitution.

They felt that the governor's chief of staff, Gray Davis (who later became governor and was then recalled in an election that led to Arnold Schwarzenegger becoming governor), should serve in that role when the governor was out of state.

The case went all the way to the California Supreme Court, and on the 100th anniversary of the adoption of California's 1879 Amended Constitution, the Supreme Court confirmed that the lieutenant governor became the acting governor of California when the governor was out of state. Carter, Curb declare flood area emergency

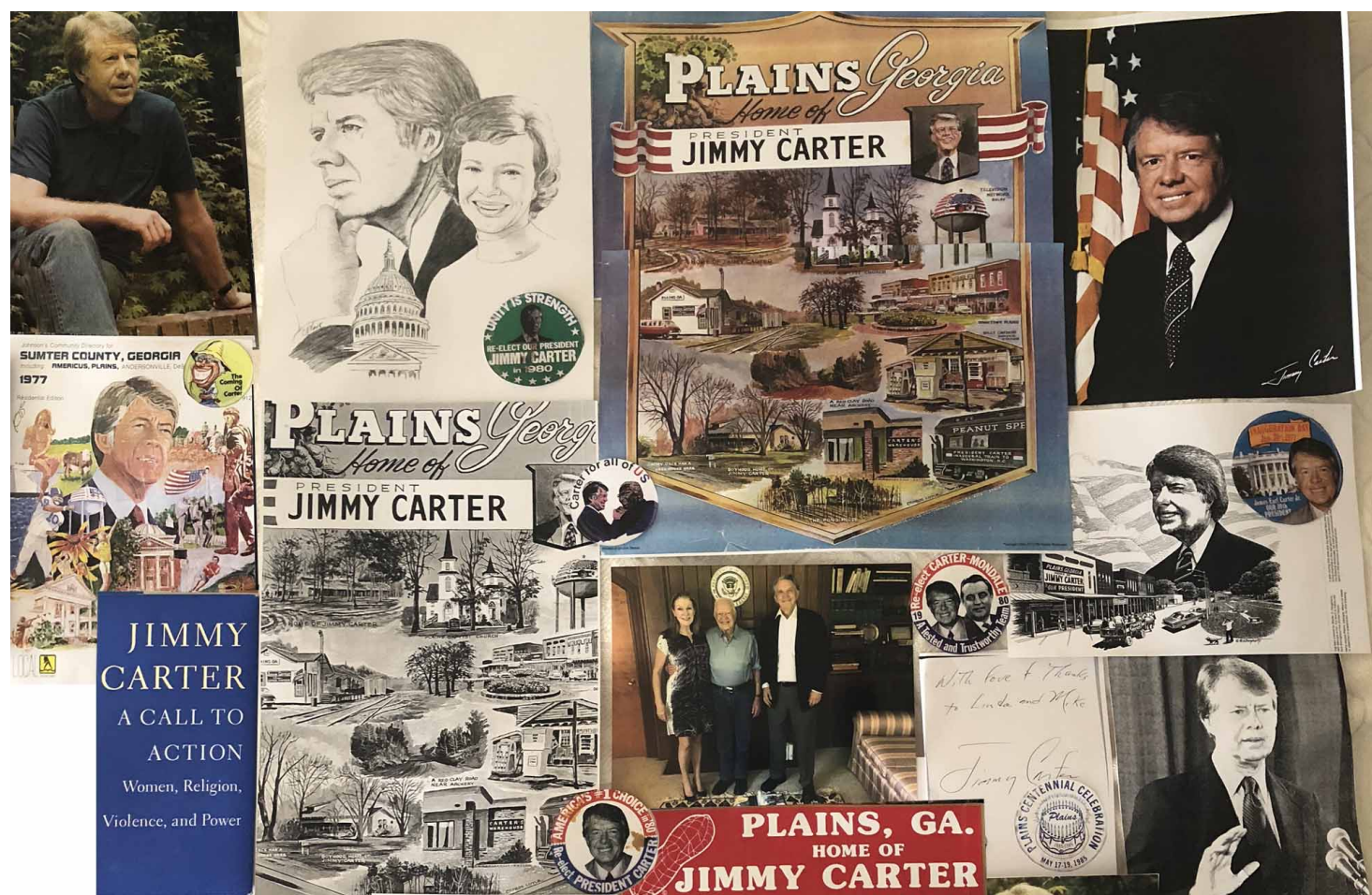
SAN BERNARDINO — Both President Carter and Lt. Gov. Mike Curb have declared states of emergency here in the wake of what Curb described as "torrential rains, winds, mudslides, floods and other conditions" that caused heavy property damage.

Carter's disaster declaration has made it possible for the Small Business Administration to begin taking applications for low-interest loans from residents whose homes were damaged in mudslides, said Rep. Jerry Lewis, R-San Bernardino.

Curb's proclamation also includes San Diego County. He invoked an article from the California Constitution that allows reconstructed property to be assessed at the same valuation it had before the disaster.

"During the time that I served as Acting Governor of California I worked positively with President Carter and his staff on various matters including important emergency declarations, health and the importance of caring for everyone. Jimmy Carter, in addition to his achievements as President has taught all of us who have served in government the responsibility and the possibility of doing even more after returning to private life."

Curb's powers upheld by state Supreme

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — In a stunning defeat for Gov. Edmund Brown Jr., the California Supreme Court has ruled that the lieutenant governor, Mike Curb, has full power as governor when Brown leaves the state.

The 4-1 opinion Thursday was written by a Brown appointee to the court, Wiley Manuel. A second Brown appointee, Frank Newman, dissented. Chief Justice Rose Bird, had disqualified herself.

"As acting governor, the lieutenant governor is free to act on whatever matters he determines need attention during the governor's absence," the decision said.

It gives Curb authority to sign or veto bills, issue executive orders, grant pardons, and, within limits, appoint judges whenever the Democratic governor leaves the state.

Brown contended Curb could exercise those powers only in an emergency. He said Curb and the first elected to their offices from opposition parties in this century.

Brown, who declared his candidacy for president last month, has been out of California for 61 days.

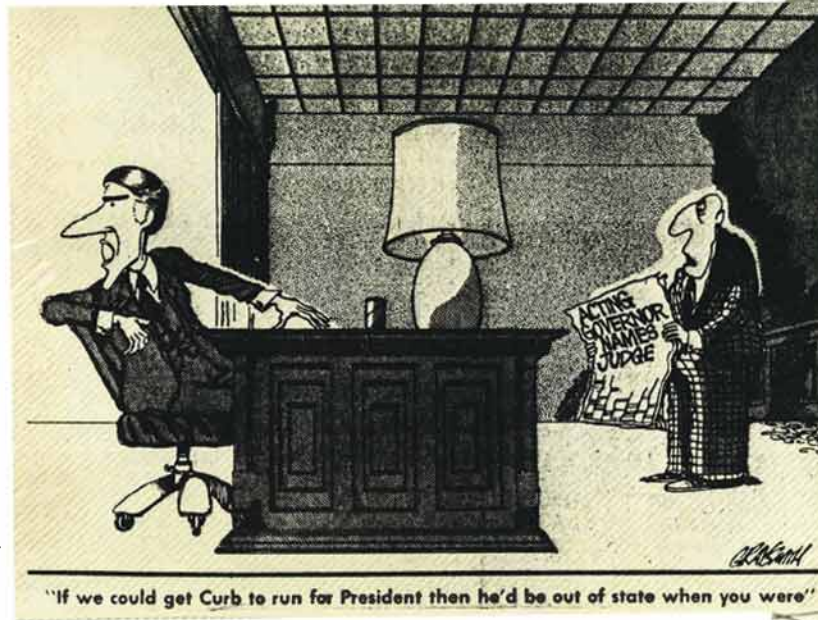

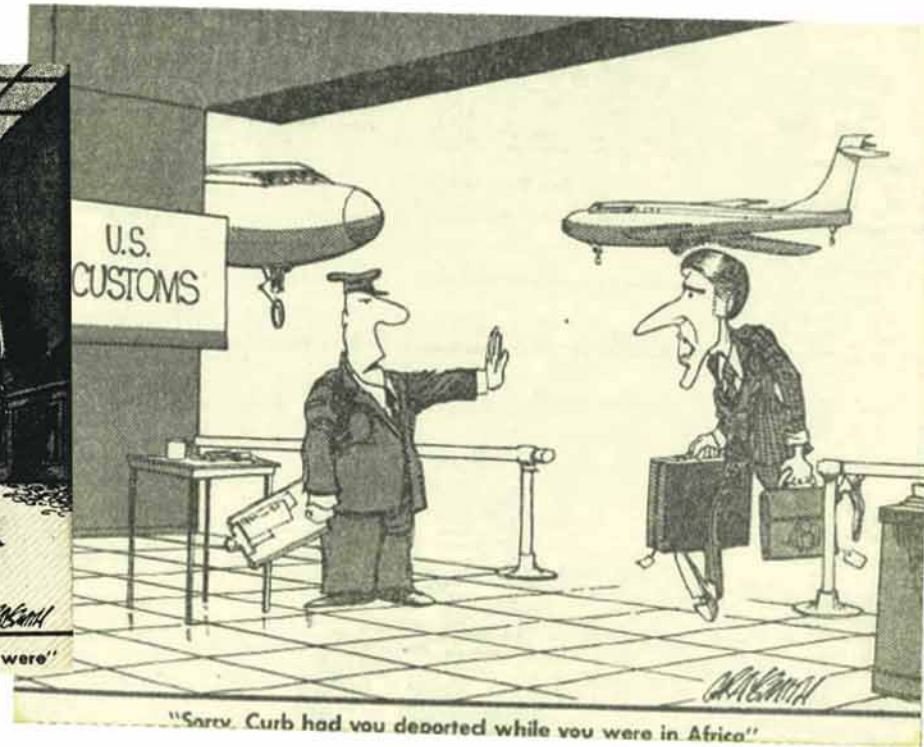

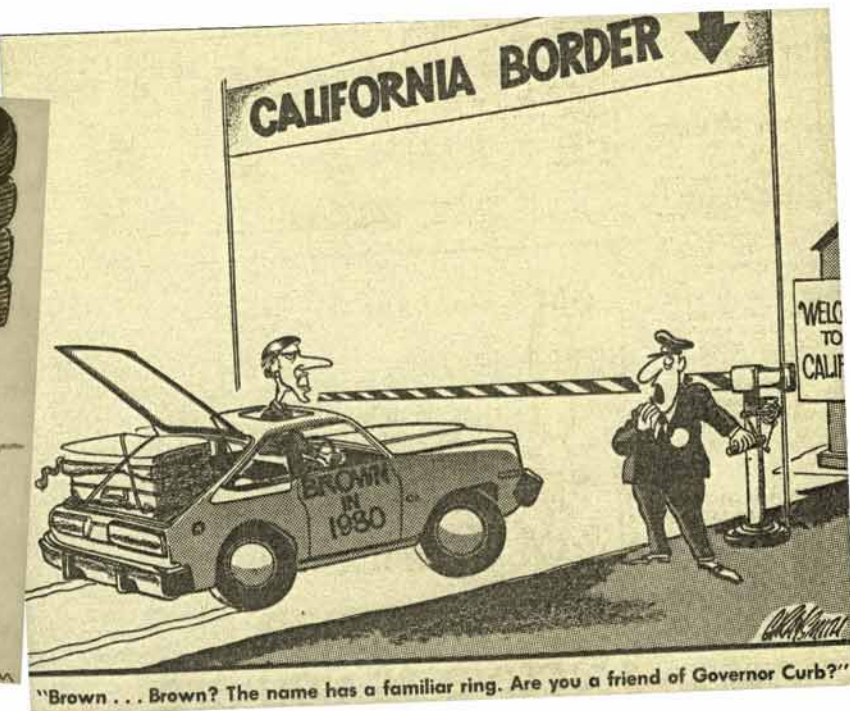

December 26, 1979 created front page stories not only in California, but in other states as well.

Theodore B. Olson represented Curb on this successful ruling. "That ruling reflected not just the power, but the responsibility of the lieutenant governor of California," Curb says. "Although it was a clear-cut case of constitutional law, my own personal experience also led me to realize the importance of the role of acting governor in certain situations." Because of the precedent this set in the largest state, Curb was elected chairman of the National Conference of Lieutenant Governors, which represented the Democratic and Republican lieutenant governors of all the states.

In 1981, Curb ran in the Republican primary for the nomination for governor of California, however, he was narrowly defeated by George Deukmejian. The election was very close —

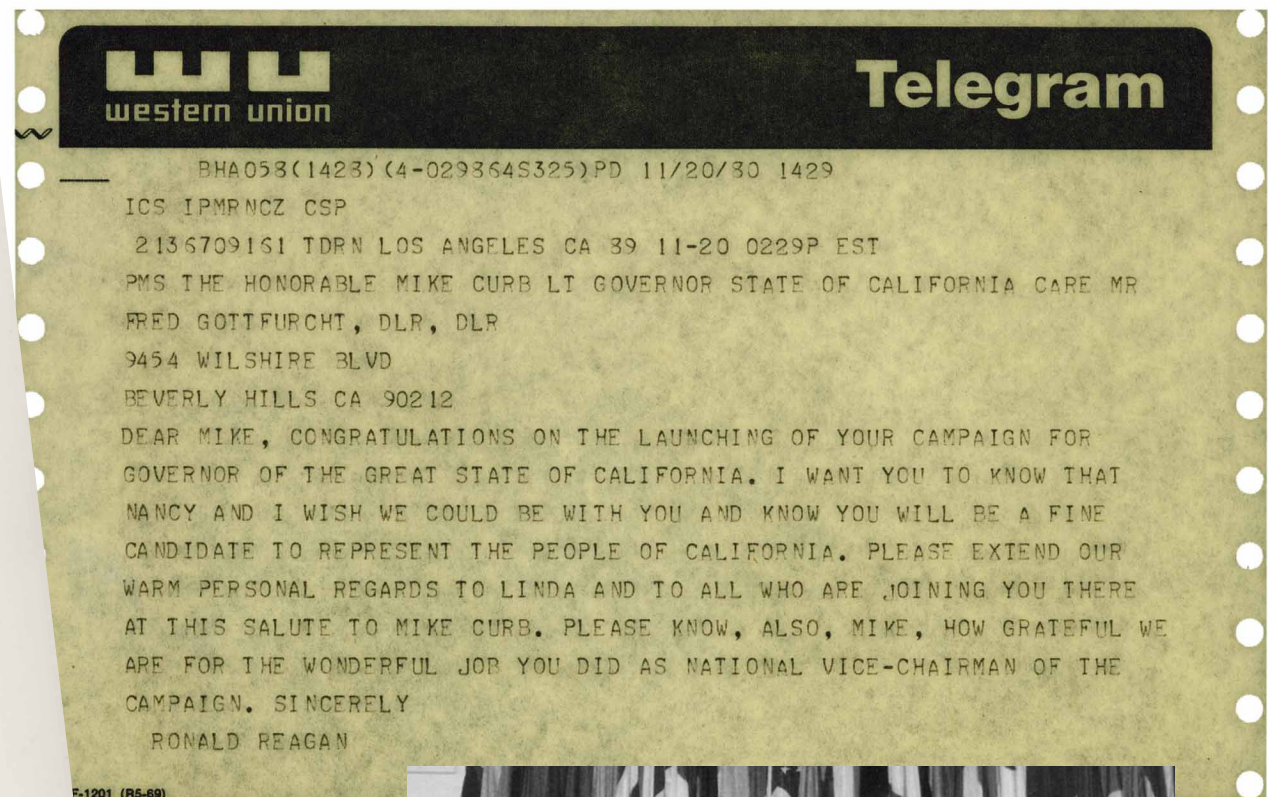

them or not.”

Curb took his job as lieutenant governor very seriously, and when Jerry Brown decided to run for president in 1980, he Curb led in every poll leading up to the election – and he could have criticized his opponent as some of his supporters suggested. Instead, he had learned a valuable lesson about uniting the party from Ronald Reagan after the 1976 presidential campaign, and so he endorsed and actively supported Deukmejian during his campaign against the Democratic opponent.

“Throughout that primary and general election, I remembered the lessons that Ronald Reagan had taught me, that sometimes the best, most defining moments of your life are not when you win, but when you lose,” Mike remembers. “It all depends on how you lose; anyone knows how to act when you win, but how we act when we lose defines us and our character.”

President Reagan appointed Curb as chairman of the Republican National Finance Committee, and the Curb family

moved to Washington, D.C., where Mike had the opportunity to do something positive for the president. Both of Mike and Linda's daughters were born while Mike was acting governor.

Ronald Reagan was very inclusive and always in favor of bringing people in – what he called “the big tent.” He was very tolerant of opposing positions as long as he wasn't forced to change his position. Even if someone questioned his position,

he was willing to listen to their view. Reagan was at a point in his life where his beliefs and philosophies were pretty well locked in, and as the 1984 election approached, it appeared that the American people shared his views.

Mike was involved in a brainstorming session on what the president should do on the Fourth of July in 1984, the year

Reagan was running for re-election. Curb was in the meeting as the head of the National Finance Committee, and Reagan's team wanted the president to do an event that might have a fundraising angle. The campaign people had decided that he should not speak anywhere else, because he was going to make an appearance in Washington D.C. on the importance of Independence Day.

They thought he should be visible, but not in a speaking role, so Mike suggested the NASCAR race at Daytona on July 4. Several people in the room looked at him like he was crazy. Mike says. "After I suggested this idea as a possibility, the president got excited and said he used to announce auto races in Des Moines, Iowa. Since it looked like the president liked this idea, everybody quickly switched their position and began talking about it."

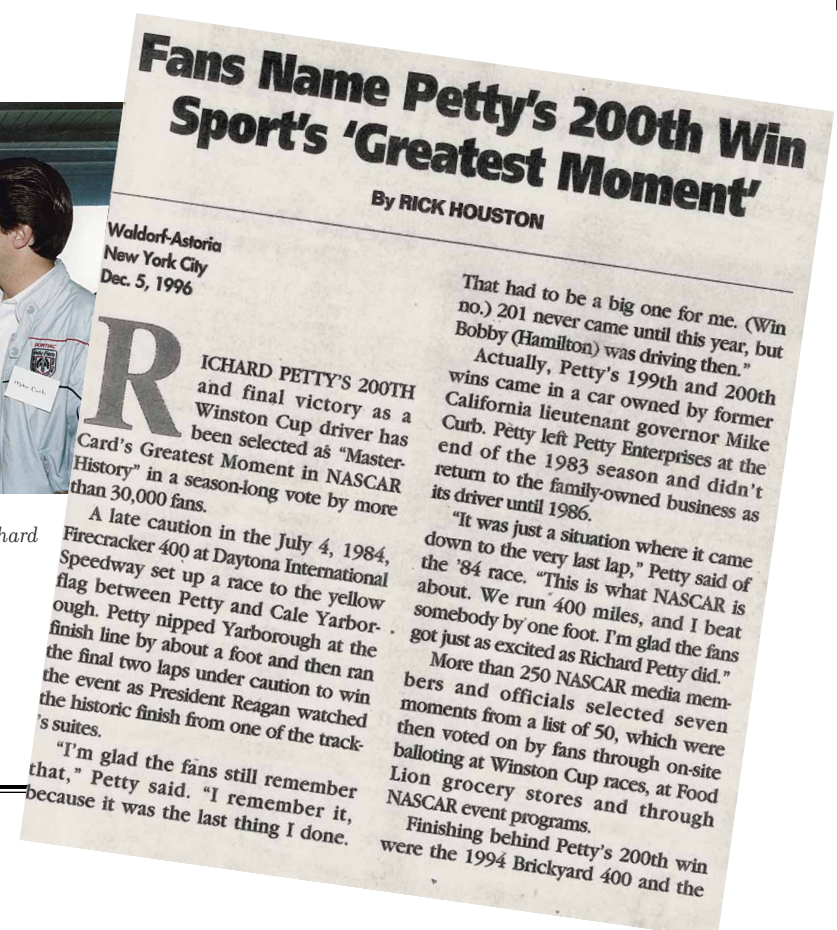
Curb was asked to pursue the idea and called Bill France Jr., the head of NASCAR. Bill France's father founded NASCAR, but Bill France Jr. was the genius who made it a national sport. France readily agreed and joined Curb in Washington, D.C., to work out the details.

A car that Mike owned, number 43, driven by Richard Petty, was in that race. Petty had won more races than any other NASCAR driver and, going into the Daytona race, had already achieved 199 wins.

Ronald Reagan came to Daytona to watch that race – he flew in on Air Force One and made a dramatic landing after the race had started. He even announced some of the race over the P.A. system. It was an historic day for the Presidency, the first time a sitting president had ever been to a NASCAR race. Richard Petty drove Mike Curb's car to his 200th win, a defin-

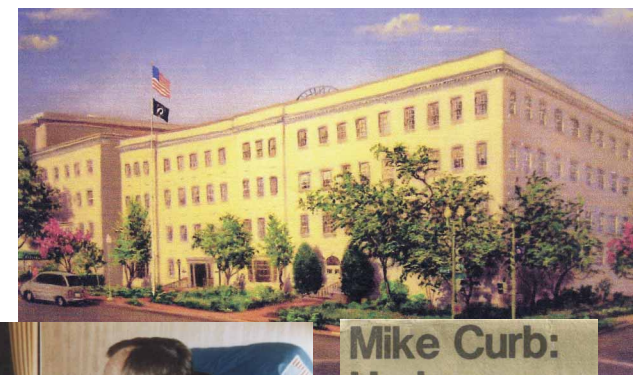

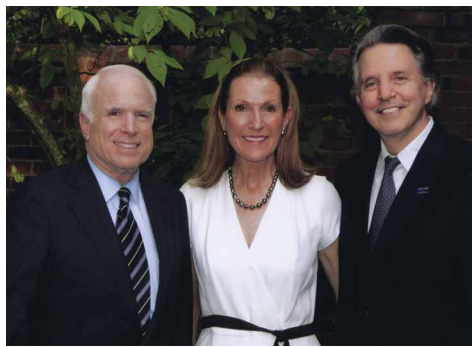

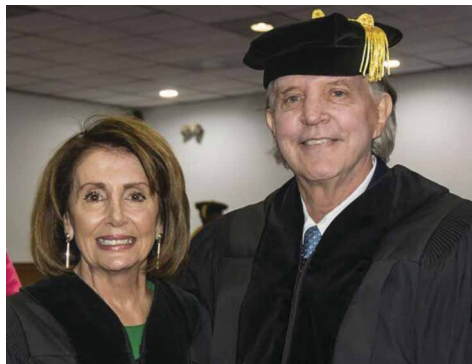
receive the Republican nomination for president and he picked Dan Quayle, who was exactly Curb's age, as his running mate.

"I realized what possibly could have happened and how thankful I was to have had the opportunity to participate in the American political system and to work with great men such as Ronald Reagan and George Bush," says Curb.

After Reagan and Bush were re-elected in 1984, Curb and his family moved back to California because it was time for Curb's daughters to start school. Upon Reagan's death, Mike and Linda Curb made a list of all of the things in their lives that would not have happened without Ronald Reagan — state chairman in 1976, national committeeman from California in 1977, and, later, a position on the National Executive Committee. He encouraged Mike to run for lieutenant governor and made television commercials supporting him. He encouraged and supported Mike as acting governor, appointed him co-chairman of his 1980 presidential campaign and chairman of the Program Committee for the national convention in 1980. Reagan even asked Mike to compose the theme song for the 1980 conven-

tion, "Together A New Beginning." Reagan also appointed Curb chairman of the National Finance Committee in 1983 and chairman of the presidential trust for his 1984 re-election. He appointed him to the International Trade Negotiation Committee and to the World USO Board.

"Basically, my entire life in government was based on more than 10 opportunities provided by Ronald Reagan," Curb says. "People ask me how I could possibly have been involved in these amazing opportunities. My answer is that I was fortunate enough to meet Ronald Reagan when I was 29 years of age at a charitable event, and he believed these things were possible."

Because Mike was significantly involved in all three Reagan presidential campaigns, the Reagan Museum acknowledged his contributions. In the words of Nancy Reagan, "I know that Ronnie would be especially honored by your generosity, and pleased that your name will be acknowledged in the Campaign/Victory and Inauguration Gallery of his museum. Thank you for sharing my dream."

Later, when the Curb family moved to Tennessee, Mike



was appointed to the Tennessee Board for Economic Growth by Governor Don Sundquist. Later, Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam appointed Curb to become Chairman of the Board of the Commission on Film, Entertainment and Music, commencing in 2012.

Mike continues to be involved as a supporter of candidates on the state and national levels. In the fall of 2008, Curb was gathered with Tennessee leaders like Senator Lamar Alexander, Senator Bill Frist, Senator Bob Corker, Senator Fred Thompson and Governor Bill Haslam at Curb's home, on the eve of the final

presidential debate between Senator John McCain and Senator Barack Obama. The debate would be held that evening at the Curb Event Center on the campus of Belmont University in Nashville.

Senator McCain relayed a story from 35 years prior that captured the spirit of Mike Curb.

“When I returned from North Vietnam with my fellow POWs, Mike and Linda Curb were gracious enough to welcome us in their home,” McCain said. “I will never forget that.”

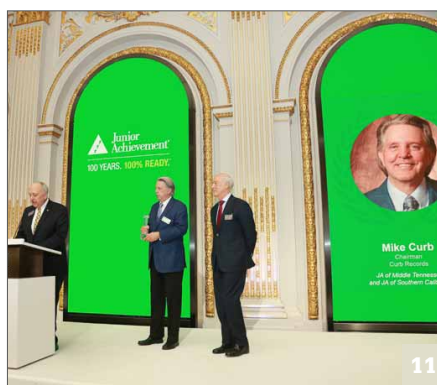
