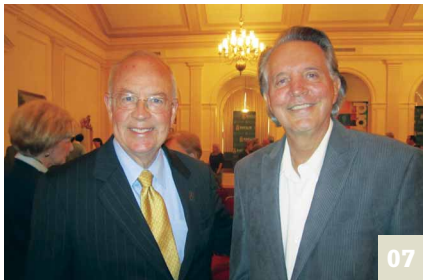

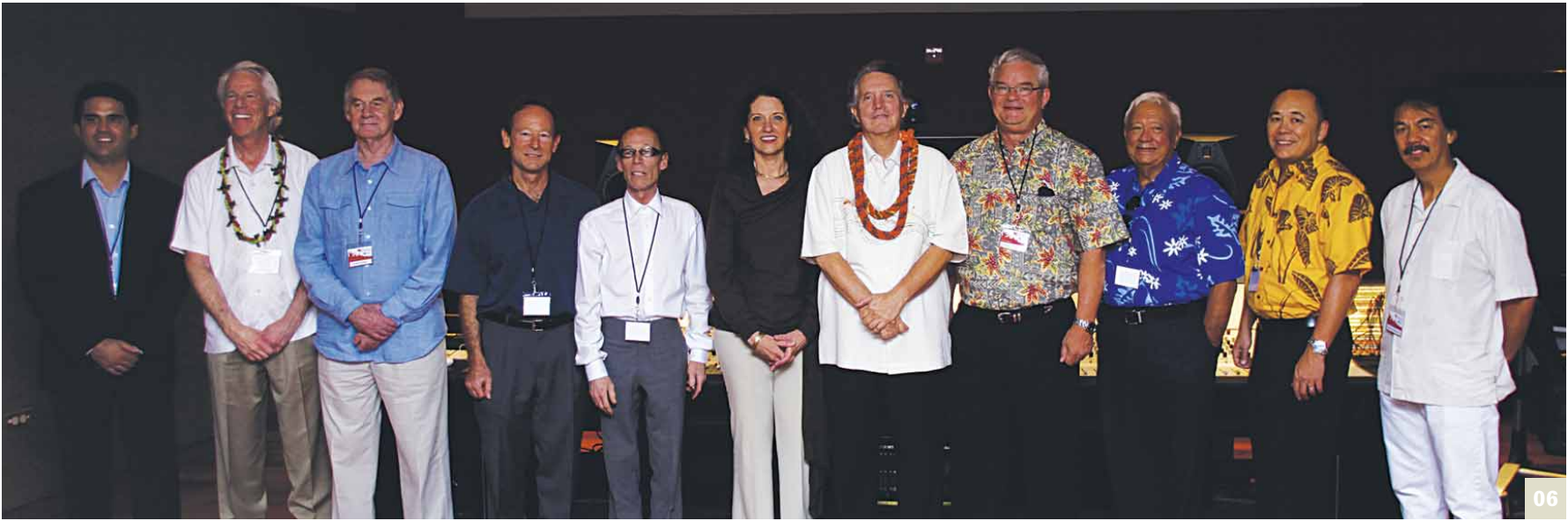

MEGAN CURB COX

*I*f there's one aspect of childhood that stands out for Megan Curb Cox, it's the importance of family dinners. "With very few exceptions, Dad was home every night, or he had taken us as a family on the trip," Megan remembers of her father, Mike Curb. "It wasn't always perfect – it may have been a little late or at a restaurant – but it was very important to him that we have dinner together."

In spite of a busy schedule often labored by the time difference between Nashville and Los Angeles, the Curb girls knew that their parents' priority was their family. Sometimes, that meant falling asleep to Dad practicing his speeches, but they had fun doing it, together. And above all, he supported their passions.

"My parents were so supportive of what we wanted to do to make the world a better place," Megan says. "Education has always been a huge thing for him, and that's become the focus of my career."

After graduating with a master's degree in elementary education from Vanderbilt University, Megan taught underserved elementary-school children in inner-city Nashville before moving to San Antonio, Texas, and taking on a similar role there.

"I've always been a big believer in books, and maybe that came from Dad reading us stories every night when we were young," Megan says. "I want to help children love reading so they can develop a love of learning. Many schools don't have the resources to implement what I learned at Vanderbilt into the curriculum, and Mom and Dad have always wanted to help provide an extra little boost."

Over the years, that has taken the form of donated computers and books, musical instruments, classroom visits, or something as simple as providing an experience to go along with a book the class was reading.

"We may have been reading a book in class, and a movie about the book had just come out," she says. "Mom and Dad would arrange for us to go as a class and see the movie – providing transportation and movie tickets and dinner – so we could make an experience out of it."

In 2006, when Megan was teaching at the KIPP Aspire Academy, a charter school in San Antonio, the Curb Family Foundation established the Eloisa Salazar Stout Library there, filling a critical need and providing opportunities the children may have otherwise not had.

"He came to visit and saw a need," she says. "So he did what he could to help. That's just the kind of person he is."

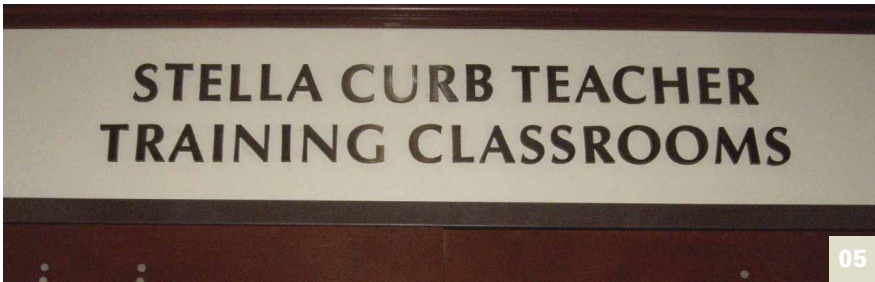

EDDIE RAY

One day the receptionist says, “There’s a young man here to see you, and his name is Mike Curb.” I had no appointment with Mike, and I had a rule that I never saw anyone without an appointment. But for some reason, which to this day I don’t understand, I broke my rule and said, “Okay, I’ll see him.”

I asked him if he had a demo to play for me, and he said, “No, I would like to do a live audition.”

I told him that was impossible, that there was no way that we were going to do a live audition. And, believe it or not – I still don’t understand it – I broke another standard rule and said, “come on, I’ll let you do a live audition.”

So he goes outside and comes back in and he brings his little keyboard and sets it up in my office. We started talking, and this young man told me every record Imperial had ever made – he knew the artists, the producers, the songwriters.

I said to myself, “This is not an ordinary appointment, so I’m going to let this kid do anything he wants to during this audition.” At the end I told him, “I’m leaving the company. In six weeks, I’m going to Capitol Records. They’re starting a new label called Tower Records. Why don’t you look me up when I go over there?” Then I forgot about it.

The first day I’m at Capitol Records, I get a call – “There’s a young man here to see you, and his name is Mike Curb.” After I got over my shock – I was so surprised – I said, “okay, send him up.” And from that day, there began a long-lasting and very profitable relationship for both of us and for Capitol Records.

It was more important to me, personally, when Mike and I took our first promotion trip together in Bakersfield, California, in 1964, and I was refused dinner service because of my color. Mike and his group threatened to leave the restaurant unless I was served, and I knew then that my relationship with Mike would last for a lifetime.

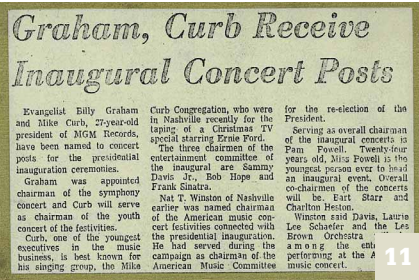
